

Public Safety Service Memorial Dedication Held on Fifteen Year Anniversary of 9/11

A Public Safety Service Memorial Dedication was held on Sunday in Williams Park, Gibsonburg, Ohio in commemoration of the fifteen year anniversary of 9/11.

It was the official dedication of the public safety service memorial, the centerpiece of which is a 36 foot long, 7,000 pound section of the main antenna mast that was atop the North Tower of the World Trade Center prior to the tragic events of September 11, 2001.

Participants included State Fire Marshal Larry Flowers, State Representative Bill Reineke, U.S. Congressman Jim Jordan, the Gibsonburg fire chief, Sandusky County EMS chief, and a number of mayors and council members from Gibsonburg and surrounding communities. The keynote address was provided by Matt Long, FDNY Firefighter and 9/11 first responder.
